
COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OVERVIEW AND FY 2002 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Tallahassee Community Redevelopment Agency (the Agency) was created in August 1998 by the City Commission of the City of Tallahassee. The Agency Board was created in September 1998 and amended in September 2002. The Agency Board is comprised of the City Commission and two County representatives. The Agency receives staff services and support from the City, the cost of which may ultimately be reimbursed to the City from available resources in the Tax Increment Trust Fund. The Tallahassee Community Redevelopment Plan was adopted and the Redevelopment Trust Fund was established by the City Commission in June 2000.

The Tallahassee Community Redevelopment Area consists of three distinct geographical sections and is comprised of over 1,450 acres of residential, commercial/retail and industrial land uses, all conveniently located near downtown Tallahassee (see boundary map on the following page). Included within the boundaries of the redevelopment area are thirteen neighborhood communities; seven major commercial/retail areas including sections of Tennessee Street, Tharpe Street, North and South Monroe Streets, Gaines Street, Lake Bradford Road and South Adams Street; and numerous mixed-use areas. In addition, the redevelopment area borders parts of the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University and the Florida State University. Extensive City infrastructure, including water, sewer, electricity and gas, are available throughout the redevelopment area.

With the Tallahassee Community Redevelopment Plan as a guide, the goal of the Agency is to formulate and implement a strategy using public and private resources to eliminate the conditions that cause the development and spread of blight within the redevelopment area. Areas where the Agency concentrates redevelopment efforts on include affordable housing, infrastructure, transportation and the promotion of mixed-use developments.

In FY 2002, the first year the Agency received tax increment funds, \$240,552 was deposited into the trust fund. Of this amount, \$175,151 was received from Leon County and \$65,401 was received from the City of Tallahassee. The Agency used \$91,459 to repay a loan from the City of Tallahassee Housing Trust Fund that was used to pay for the preparation of the Tallahassee Community Redevelopment Plan in 2000. The remaining funds, \$149,093, have been programmed for planned FY 2003 infrastructure and affordable housing improvements as part of the City's Community Neighborhood Renaissance Program with the Providence Neighborhood.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The annual report provides the Tallahassee Community Redevelopment Agency's financial statement for the period from 1 October 2001 to 30 September 2002.

FINANCIAL STATUS:

During the FY 2002, the Agency received \$240,552 in tax increment funds from Leon County (\$175,151) and the City of Tallahassee (\$65,401). In September, the Agency repaid a loan in the amount of \$91,459 to the City of Tallahassee Housing Trust Fund. The loan from the Housing Trust Fund was used by the Agency to prepare the Tallahassee Redevelopment Plan. No trust funds were used to reimburse the City for staff services and support provided by the City to the Agency.

As of 30 September 2002, the Agency had total assets of \$149, 093. The Agency had no had no outstanding liabilities, although \$149,093 has been budgeted for planned affordable housing, streetscape and infrastructure improvements in the Providence Neighborhood as part of the City's Community Neighborhood Renaissance Program.
